



Mission Connection went electronic in January 2009. The electronic format allows us to provide more information, using less World Evangelism Fund money.

How do I subscribe?

Go to the Subscription Page of the nazarene.org site <<http://www.nazarene.org/subscriber.aspx>>, fill in the appropriate information (the only required fields are first and last names and the e-mail address), and check the box for *Mission Connection*.

Anyone can subscribe. Encourage your whole council and any people who help with publicity to subscribe, as well as your pastor.

How frequently will I receive *Mission Connection*?

You will receive an e-mail each month, ideally early in the month prior to the issue month. In the e-mail are blurbs for each article with a link to the whole story. There is also a link for readers to download the entire magazine.

How can I use the electronic version of the magazine?

- Download articles, and e-mail them to members of your NMI council or to others who may be helping with publicity.
- Download articles, and post them on your church's Web site.
- Copy/paste portions of articles for the church newsletter or bulletin.
- Print the downloadable reproducible. Copy it, and insert in your church's worship folders.
- Print testimonials for use in small groups.
- Print the children's page, copy it, and distribute it to your children's mission group.



What do I do if I don't have a computer or if I have a slow Internet connection?

Ask people in your congregation to help you. This is a great way of involve someone new to the church or a young person. Let the person know that it will require printing several pages of text each month.

Use it as a teaching time. Meet with the person to review the articles in the magazine, and explain why one will be useful and another may not be practical for your congregation. Ask for that person's (or your council's) input as to whether an idea could be adapted for your church.

What if I have an idea for *Mission Connection*?

Mission Connection still needs your ideas, suggestions, and photos of mission events at your church, so e-mail them to missionconnection@nazarene.org.
